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Dear Parents and Carers

### **Recent Events**

## **School Uniform**

In the last academic year, we introduced grey shorts following consultation with the school forum to great success and it has been great to see these worn all year round. This remains an option for all students to follow.

In September, we are going to be re-emphasising our expectations around uniform. Information around this will be shared with students, parents and carers, but there will be a standard approach of one uniform issue resulting in a detention consequence. Further and repeated issues will then be progressed through our behaviour system, with additional consequences to follow. We value parents and carers who support our uniform expectations on a daily basis and will be increasing our engagement if our standards are not met.

Please can I therefore remind parents and carers around expectations, specifically around types of shorts (not branded or sports shorts), nose piercings and jewellery. In addition, I would like to highlight that from September there will be a revisiting of the requirement for knee length skirts to be worn which would be around the same length of the shorts mentioned above.

Students also need to have a bag with them at all times to carry their books and equipment and we are making a strong recommendation around this that they should have two straps on these, such as rucksack style, which will support their posture much better. We would ask that this be taken into account if any new bags are being purchased.
