INSET Day for Staff

Staff returned to school from the Easter break on Tuesday 22nd April for an INSET day where they spent some time looking at our key values of mutual respect and positive relationships through the eyes of some of the protected characteristics; we had a representative from the charity SARI (Stand Up for Racism and Inequality) work with the staff which was really useful. We were also lucky to have a selection of our own students who are members of our Culture Club, Women's Rights and LGBTQ+ groups come in and directly work with staff about how, from their perspective, the school manages situations where students perhaps say something inappropriate and how this might be handled. Staff also spent time that day working around the area of dyslexia along with time spent in their own departmental areas.

Expectation Assemblies

Students returned to school on Wednesday 23rd April and all year groups had an expectations assembly. Mr Cocks spoke with Year 11 students about the coming weeks as their GCSE and other Level 2 course examinations begin. Myself and Mr Stirling-Turner spoke with each of the main school year groups where we talked about all of the positive things that have happened in the period up to the Easter break and set the scene for the forthcoming term. We also spent some time talking once more about our core values and linking this to the staff training which had happened the previous day. Dr John spoke with both of the Sixth Form year groups to welcome them back and get them ready for the term ahead and forthcoming examinations.

Thank you to all of the parents and carers who took part in the Year 7 Parents' Evening. I stood in for a Mathematics class as we have had some teacher movement and it was lovely to be able to speak to so many parents and carers and hear how this year group have settled in.
