What Can You Expect?

The success of our students here at Chew Valley Sixth Form is due to a range of factors, a number of which are listed below:

- Quality teaching: your relationship with your teachers is much more adult and this will play an important part in your success.
- Independent study time to work on assignments but lots of help from your teachers.
- Enrichment opportunities work experience, in-class support, sport, dancing, ready steady cook and many more.
- Social events organised by the Sixth Form, such as the end of year ball and barbecues.
- The Sixth Form Council are consulted about how to improve the running of the Sixth Form and are proactive in starting new initiatives that reflect the students' interests and passions.
- A superb Sixth Form Centre, with study facilities, a Common Room and café.
- Being treated as an individual but expected to perform to the best of your ability.



The Sixth Form is an opportunity for students to further their knowledge and understanding in subjects already taken, as well as to branch out and explore completely new areas.

We run courses at Advanced Level alongside Level 3 vocational courses and a large number of extracurricular opportunities. As a result of the nature of the courses which we offer, there is a minimum entry requirement for admission to the Sixth Form. All students joining us must have achieved 5 Grade 4s at GCSE, including English Language and Maths.

All courses allow for progression to higher and further education and to enhanced career opportunities. The Open Evening in November is the ideal opportunity to find out more about the Sixth Form in general and the courses we offer in particular. 6th Form Plus

We want to make sure that everyone does something active in one afternoon session a week in order to get a break from academic studies, demonstrate effective teamwork skills and have fun.

Every Tuesday afternoon students take part in a wide range of different activities including aerobics, archery and dodgeball as well as more traditional team sports such as netball, hockey, football and rugby. If there are other activities a group of students would like to get involved in, we encourage them to let us know, and we will do our best to put it on.







All students are encouraged to get involved in the many other enrichment projects available in the Sixth Form. Entry Criteria


All students joining us must have achieved 5 Grade 4s at GCSE, including English Language and Maths. Individual subjects will also have their own entry criteria.
