

## **Well done to our students on some fabulous results!**

Hot on the heels of our A level results Chew Valley School has another set of individual scores to cheer loudly about. At a time where the 'new' GCSE examinations have been written widely about in the press as being more challenging than their predecessors our students worked really hard in order to be able to achieve this summer.

Nearly a third of the cohort students achieved levels of either a 7, 8 or 9 in English for instance, all of which are equivalent to at least an old-fashioned grade A or above which was wonderful to see. 75% of students achieved the benchmark score of at least a 4 in both English and mathematics.

The breadth of curriculum choices in place already at Chew Valley have continued to support broad student achievement for all of our students regardless of their ability and this coupled with our extra-curricula offer has set the students up well for their next steps with many of them choosing to return to our sixth form.

There were exceptional performances with the following students achieving an average grade of at least an 8:

Matilda Hawken, Ellie Alford, Samuel Maddison, Chloe Bryant, Mollie Jeffries and Jack Parsons.

In addition Jenny Heath deserves particular mention for achieving a 9 in all of her examinations and is also able to add an A\* in Latin to this list which was studied as an extra course.
